

LONG STAY

The long-stay visa, which constitutes a residency document, allows an extended stay in France for a period of more than 90 days.

Monaco (all types of long stay visas)

No visa shall be issued if the applicant is already living in France.

Personal appearance is mandatory for all applicants to file the visa application and to pick up the visa.

- **All documents have to be in original and copy*. Consular section does not make any copy**
- **All foreign documents must be translated in French by a certified translator compliant**
- **Missing document (original or copy) = incomplete file = high risk of visa refusal;**
- **The application fee is not refundable): 99.- € - for each applicant payable only cash**

LIST OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED: (ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS AND COPIES IN THE SAME ORDER)

Documents to be provided (originals + 3 copies of all your originals)

<input type="checkbox"/>	1.	The present list of documents on which you will have ticked each document attached and copies.
<input type="checkbox"/>	2.	Three long stay visa forms: Forms must be completely and legibly filled in with black or blue ink, dated and signed by the applicant.
<input type="checkbox"/>	3.	Three identity photos with french norms : the photos must be recent (less than six months), in color on a clear background, taken from the front, passport size – 35mm x 45mm, clearly showing the face, the forehead hairline and ears. To check the size please consult : Photos
<input type="checkbox"/>	4.	Passport in good condition , with a date of expiration at least 3 months after the end of the student's proposed stay in France, issued within the past 10 years and containing at least 2 blank pages. The visa is validated by a self-adhesive label that will be affixed to one of the pages of the passport (copy of principal pages) . The passport will be returned the day of your deposit request.
<input type="checkbox"/>	5.	A Austria, Hungarian, Czech, Slovak, Slovenia residence permit valid at the time of filing the application until the entry in France.
<input type="checkbox"/>	6.	Extract from police record in Austria, czech republic hungary, slovakia and slovenia
<input type="checkbox"/>	7.	A solemn attestation declaring that the applicant has never been condemned either in his country of origin or elsewhere, that he was never declared bankrupt and that there is no criminal litigation against him in a court of law or on police files.
<input type="checkbox"/>	8.	Evidence related to the purpose of his stay: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student's official acceptance letter or acknowledgment of enrollment, specifying exact dates of attendance and length of the studies + receipt of payment ; • or a work contract validated by the Employment Service of the Principality ; • or an application for authorization to start a business or a company ; • or evidence of marriage for the spouses of French nationals, Monacans or foreigners who reside in Monaco ; • or a bank confirmation which substantiates his means of livelihood : determining the extent of such means rests solely with Monaco Authorities ; the bank confirmation certifying that the applicant can subsist in Monaco without a gainful activity is considered sufficient.
<input type="checkbox"/>	9.	Evidence of accommodation : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a lease contract or a promise of lease ; • or a property ownership deed ; • or a certificate of gratuitous accommodation issued by the Public Security of Monaco ; or a written undertaking by the applicant to submit within a three-month period following his arrival in the Principality one of these three attestations.
<input type="checkbox"/>	10.	Application fees (non-refundable) : 99 € payable only cash

* A scanned document is not considered an original document.

** Delays are variable according to the nationality (15 days to 2 months)
